



Minutes of Suburban Lancaster Sewer Authority

July 28, 2022

The Board of Suburban Lancaster Sewer Authority met at the West Lampeter Township Municipal Building, 852 Village Road, Lampeter, Pennsylvania, on July 28, 2022 at 4:00 P.M.

The following members of the Board were present: James K. Witman, Randal E. Moyer, Devin Groff and Eric Lucas. Also present were Frank P. Mincarelli, Esquire, of Blakinger Thomas, PC, Solicitor; and Thomas C. Donahue, P.E. and Byrne Remphrey, P.E. of CDM Smith, Consulting Engineers.

The minutes of the June meeting were read and, upon motion made by Devin Groff, seconded by Randal E. Moyer, were unanimously approved as submitted.

<u>CORRESPONDENCE</u>: Chairman James K. Witman reviewed all of the items of correspondence received since the last meeting, copies of which are filed with and incorporated into these minutes by reference.

<u>CONSULTING ENGINEER'S REPORT</u>: Thomas C. Donahue P.E. and Byrne Remphrey, P.E. of CDM Smith reviewed the monthly Engineer's Report, a copy of which is filed with and incorporated into these minutes by reference, and discussed the following:

1. <u>Capacity Requests:</u>

- a. <u>SouthPointe at Lakes Expansion</u>: After a capacity approval letter dated July 1st from West Lampeter Township was received, CDM Smith issued a final capacity approval letter dated July 6th for the net increase of 1 EDU of additional of sewage capacity for this consolidated land development project.
- b. <u>1549 Mentzer Road</u>: West Lampeter Township approved the capacity request on July 11th. CDM Smith scheduled a meeting for August 11th with Mr. King to provide him with the lateral installation agreement in person.
- c. <u>Millport Road Area Tributary to the City's Conestoga Garden Pumping Station (CGPS)</u>: CDM Smith is reviewing ongoing flow monitoring data (through June 30th). In collaboration with the City, CDM Smith may decide to adjust or eliminate the location of one or two manholes based on its evaluation of further data. Mr. Rehab completed repairing (by chemical injection grouting) six leaky manholes within the CGPS sewer shed on June 16th.

- 2. Review of Developer's Plans: Willow Acres The Authority agreed with CDM Smith's recommendation to require that the width of a sewer easement be increased where the as-built alignment of the forcemain (to be dedicated to the Authority) deviates from the forcemain alignment depicted on the approved design plans.
- 3. <u>Capacity Utilization Calculation</u>: CDM Smith completed the quarterly update of the Calculation of Capacity Utilization to reflect the second quarter of 2022. The calculation compares the Authority's net capacity at the City Plant with the allotted capacity remaining to be used the Authority and is performed on both a hydraulic and nutrient-limited basis. On a hydraulic basis, the calculation for the second quarter shows 1.88 MGD of remaining capacity prior to consideration of existing commitments and 1.78 MGD of capacity after commitments. On a nutrient-limited basis, the calculation shows 1.04 MGD prior to consideration of existing commitments and 0.97 MGD after commitments.

4. Municipal Partners:

- a. <u>CDM</u> Smith reported attending a quarterly Municipal Partners meeting on July 12th where an updated list of the City of Lancaster's (the City) future Capital Sewer Projects was distributed. Based on the City's future Capital Sewer Projects List, projected Authority escrow payments due to the City for the next 6 months were summarized on a table included in the Engineer's Report.
- b. For two projects on the City's capital projects list (interceptor capacity evaluation projects for Conestoga Gardens and Steven Avenue Pumping Stations) the City has scheduled a meeting for August 2nd with officials of ELSA and SLSA to discuss revised Partner cost share amounts, as determined by the City in response to ELSA's proposed request for different cost share amounts for consideration by the City and SLSA.
- 5. <u>Financial Matters</u>: <u>Annual Audit</u> As authorized by the Authority in June, Trout CPA is proceeding with preparing the annual audit for fiscal year 2022 (ending June 30, 2022). CDM Smith will provide requested information / documentation to Trout for the audit.

6. Operation and Maintenance Issues:

- a. <u>Grease</u> JG Environmental last cleaned Lyndon Pump Station on April 26th and Sterling Place Pump Station on July 5th. Grease removal volumes at Lyndon Pump Station continue to be greatly reduced since dosing with the biological additive has been implemented. CDM Smith is continuing to monitor grease accumulation at Sterling Place Pump Station, including tabulating and graphing monthly grease removal volumes.
- b. <u>Chemical Addition Program for Grease and Odor Control</u> For the new dosing systems installed by Evoqua at the three largest pumping stations (Lyndon, Mill Creek, and Goods Run), CDM Smith is coordinating with GES

Automation to develop record schematic electrical drawings (one line wiring diagrams) for documentation of the as-built electrical configurations of the dosing systems. A motion was made by Devin Groff, seconded by Randal E. Moyer, to approve a quote for \$640 from GES for the work needed to prepare the record drawings. The motion carried unanimously. The obsolete electrical schematics at the pumping stations will be removed when new versions are available. The City will be sent the draft version of the drawings for review prior to finalization.

c. Mill Creek Pump Station – During the Chapter 94 pumping station inspection in February, the two check valves for Pumps #3 and #4 were found to be leaking back flow when the pumps are off. In May, the Authority approved the rebuild cost quote of \$12,634.00 and the City has ordered the parts. Parts are expected to arrive by the end of August.

Additionally, two surge relief valves, eight pressure sensors, and four flexible expansion joints on pump suction and/or discharge piping at Mill Creek Pumping Station were found to be faulty or badly deteriorated. CDM Smith is coordinating with the City and vendors to obtain cost quotes for replacement or rebuild of these items.

For the eight faulty pressure sensors (seal water and pump discharge for each pump), CDM Smith met with Edwin L. Heim Company (Heim) at the station on June 23rd and Heim subsequently provided a quote for \$23,999 (COSTARS pricing) for purchase and installation of new sensors. A motion was made by Devin Groff, seconded by Randal E. Moyer, to approve the quote from Edward L. Heim for the replacement of eight faulty pressure sensors at the station. The motion carried unanimously.

- d. Goods Run Pump Station: The City reported in June that the Muffin Monster channel grinder #2 motor shorted out. The City removed the grinder unit and sent it to Heim for further evaluation. A motion was made by Devin Groff, seconded by Randal E. Moyer, to approve a quote for \$5,500 from Heim for repair/rebuild of the motor and drive system (rather than a quote for \$9,535 from JWC Environmental for full replacement of these parts). The motion carried unanimously.
- e. <u>Millstream Village Pump Station</u> In June, the City reported that Pump #2 was pulled and sent to Heim for evaluation due to high vibrations coming from the pump. A motion was made by Devin Groff, seconded by Randal E. Moyer, to approve a quote from Heim for \$9,500 for repair/rebuild of the pump (rather than a quote for \$18,542 Essco Pumps and Controls for a new pump). The motion carried unanimously.

7. Erosion within SLSA Easement near the City WWTP Outfall:

a. The Authority has reached out to the townships (including attending the West Lampeter Township Board of Supervisors' meeting on July 11th) and all three townships all confirmed their commitment to the project. Blakinger Thomas will submit a revised/amended ARPA funding request to the

County accordingly. Gannett Fleming met with PENNVEST on July 12th and confirmed that the Authority is only eligible for a low interest loan from PENNVEST, not grant funding. The Authority decided that anticipated costs for preparing a PENNVEST application and for complying with other PENNVEST requirements are too burdensome to be worthwhile for a PENNVEST loan for this project.

b. CDM Smith provided the Board with a technical memorandum on July 27th detailing its findings and recommendations from this forcemain condition assessment, primarily that no immediate repairs to the older parallel LYFM are currently needed. As requested by the Authority, CDM Smith will plan for ongoing periodic condition assessment of the LYFM and other Authority forcemains, and will document this plan in the Annual Chapter 94 Report and/or other suitable Authority document. CDM Smith is continuing to coordinate with Gannett Fleming on the work being done for both parallel Lyndon Forcemains.

Following a discussion on the matter, a motion was made by Devin Groff, seconded by Randal E. Moyer, to approve a modified Option #3 from Gannett Fleming as the remediation choice for the erosion problem. The motion carried unanimously.

8. Other Matters:

- a. <u>Strategic Planning</u> Keystone Alliance Consulting (Keystone) is preparing a utility rate study for the Authority as an initial step toward the likely development of a strategic plan for the Authority. Keystone provided the Authority with a detailed list of information needed from it for the rate study, and CDM Smith provided Keystone with all the requested information.
- b. <u>Customer Access to Account Information</u> As requested by the Authority, CDM Smith will inquire with Authority's billing service about the possibility of providing customers with access to their account information.
- c. <u>Energy Savings</u> As requested by the Authority, CDM Smith will inquire with Paradise Energy Solutions (or a similar company) about the feasibility of installing solar panels on any suitable Authority-owned properties.

<u>SOLICITOR'S REPORT</u>: Frank P. Mincarelli of Blakinger Thomas, PC delivered the following report:

- 1. Frank reported that the developer of Conestoga Reserve has requested the release of its 15% maintenance bond now that 18 months has expired. A motion was made by Randal E. Moyer, seconded by Devin Groff, to approve the release of the maintenance bond. The motion carried unanimously.
- 2. He then reported on the status of the County ARPA application which must be amended to include the amount requested, the amount committed by other sources and the updated total project cost. A motion was made by Devin

Groff, seconded by Randal E. Moyer, to amend and resubmit the application to the County. The motion carried unanimously.

- 3. He then discussed the delinquent sewer account of Stryten Energy which is a monthly metered customer that owes about \$4,300 in user fees. Tom Donahue has contact information for Stryten and will contact the company about the matter.
- 4. Frank distributed and reviewed the monthly report on collection activities performed over the past 30 days, including a report on the status of lien foreclosure proceedings.
- 5. He then presented the following requisitions for payment from the Authority's trust accounts were presented for the Board's consideration:
- a) Construction Fund Requisition C-02-762 payable to CDM Smith, for Invoice No. 90155742 in the amount of \$16,766.95;
- b) Construction Fund Requisition C-02-763 payable to Gannett Fleming, for Invoices No. 10760 in the amount of \$14,788.20;
- c) Construction Fund Requisition C-02-764 payable to Fulton Bank for City WWTP Composting Demolition in the amount of \$30,712;
- d) Construction Fund Requisition C-02-765 payable to Fulton Bank for City WWTP Primary Electric Service Upgrade Project in the amount of \$39,088;
- e) Construction Fund Requisition C-02-766 payable to Fulton Bank for City WWTP Special & Emergency Capital Improvements Project in the amount of \$53,048;
- f) Construction Fund Requisition C-02-767 payable to CSL Services, Inc., for Invoice No. SSL-2202 for CGPS flow monitoring in the amount of \$3,900;
- g) Construction Fund Requisition C-02-768 payable to Groundscape, Inc., for Invoice No. 4377 for site restoration work at 1 Sarah Lane in the amount of \$681; and
- h) Revenue Fund Requisition #R96-276 payable to SLSA's administrative checking account for administrative expenses in the amount of \$150,000.

A motion was made by Randal E. Moyer, seconded by Devin Groff, to approve the foregoing requisitions as presented. The motion carried unanimously.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Tom Donahue reported that the balance in the administrative checking account as of July 28, 2022, with all bills paid and

requisitions processed, was \$90,044.10 and the balance in the escrow account as of that date was \$28,604.53.

A motion was made by Devin Groff, seconded by Randal E. Moyer, to approve payment of all the bills and to accept the report as presented. The motion carried unanimously.

There being no further business, a motion was made by Devin Groff, seconded by Randal E. Moyer, to adjourn the meeting at 6:25 P.M. and to meet in regular session on Thursday, August 25, at 4:00 P.M. at the West Lampeter Township Municipal Building, 852 Village Road, Lampeter, PA. The motion carried unanimously.

ENGINEER'S REPORT SUBURBAN LANCASTER SEWER AUTHORITY

A. MANAGEMENT PLAN/CAPACITY REQUESTS

The Management Plan and Capacity Request List have been updated as of July 31, 2022 and are attached to this Engineer's Report. The monthly updates to both the EDU tracking by municipality and the tracking of developments without capacity reservation are also attached to this Engineer's Report.

Capacity Approvals

No final capacity approvals have been issued since the July SLSA meeting.

Pending Capacity Approvals

1549 Mentzer Road – CDM Smith previously reported receiving a capacity request from Mr. Enos King on June 17, 2022 requesting one (1) EDU of sewage capacity for the existing Amish farmhouse at 1549 Mentzer Road in West Lampeter Township. The farmhouse is currently connected to a failing on-lot septic system. Two SLSA sewer mains run across this farm property, but there is no existing lateral for the property. CDM Smith confirmed that sufficient sewage capacity is available in SLSA's system for connection of this single residence. The Authority approved this capacity request in June contingent on receipt of documentation of capacity approval from West Lampeter Township and Mr. King's execution of a lateral installation agreement prepared by Blakinger Thomas. The Township approved this capacity request on July 11, 2022. CDM Smith met with Mr. King on August 11, 2022 to provide him with the lateral installation agreement in person. Mr. King has not yet executed this agreement.

New Capacity Requests

No new capacity requests have been received since the July SLSA meeting.

Notable Capacity Inquiries

3102 and 417 Willow Street Pike – On August 12, 2022, CDM Smith was contacted by Bohler Engineering, on behalf of The Ferber Company, to inquire about available sewage capacity for a 40 to 80 EDU commercial development (including a gas station/convenience store, car wash, and medical office building) at 3102 and 417 Willow Street Pike in Pequea Township, along with the possibility of connecting to SLSA's system as shown on the attached marked up SLSA GIS map. As listed on the attached Development Projects Status Table, the Authority previously approved 23 EDUs of sewage capacity for these properties (listed as the Steudler Tract) in September 2019. CDM Smith will discuss the developer's proposed means of connecting to SLSA's system with the Authority at the August meeting.

Millport Road Area tributary to the City's Conestoga Garden Pumping Station (CGPS) - As previously discussed with the Authority throughout 2021 in response to two capacity inquiries, CDM Smith evaluated SLSA's flow to CGPS for 2018-2021. In 2018 and 2019, SLSA's flow was below its capacity allocation at CGPS, but in 2020 and 2021 SLSA exceeded its allocation. The increased flow is beyond the amount that can be attributed to new connections to SLSA's system in this area. Therefore further



data evaluation/investigation is needed to determine the reason for SLSA's increased flows to CGPS. Data evaluation activities completed in 2021 resulted in confirmation that the numerous flowmeters used to compute SLSA's flow to CGPS have been calibrated regularly, verification of EDU counts for unmetered areas including in SLSA's computed flow, and confirmation of reasonable accuracy of other inputs to the City's flow calculation (particularly flow metering data for ELSA's three metering pits tributary to CGPS). SLSA's computed flows to CGPS continue to be tracked weekly. Because data evaluation efforts did not reveal the reason for SLSA increase flows, field investigation work (such as manhole inspections, smoke testing, pipe televising, and flow monitoring) are needed to try to identify the source of increased flows. At the December meeting, CDM Smith presented preliminary scope and budget information for flow monitoring to be conducted in Spring 2022. At the January meeting, we reported that the City is also preparing to conduct flow infiltration/inflow investigation work (particularly flow monitoring) within the tributary basin of CGPS in Spring/Summer 2022 and would be interested in teaming with SLSA for potential shared cost savings. The Authority approved teaming with the City on the flow monitoring work. In February and March, CDM Smith participated in coordination meetings with the City and provided the City with scope input for SLSA to be included in the City's request for proposals (RFP) to prospective flow monitoring companies. The City issued the RFP on April 11 and bids were received April 22. In late April, the City awarded the work to the low bidder and the Authority approved the estimated cost (\$28,500) for SLSA's portion of the flow monitoring contract. The flowmeters were installed in May and monitoring over a 2-week trial period was completed in early June. CDM Smith is reviewing ongoing flow monitoring data (through July 31, 2022). In collaboration with the City, we may decide to adjust or eliminate the location one or two manholes based on our evaluation of further data. As previously reported, Mr. Rehab completed repairing (by chemical injection grouting) six leaky manholes within the CGPS sewershed on June 16.

The report of connections to the sewer system and permits issued during the month of July is attached to this Engineer's Report.

B. DEVELOPMENT PLANS/PROJECTS

The Development Projects Status Table is attached to this Engineer's Report. Since the July SLSA meeting, no development plans (initial or revised) have been reviewed. CDM Smith continued to conduct construction inspection activities for Willow Acres.

C. INSPECTIONS

During the month of July, CDM Smith conducted inspections of construction of new sewer extensions/facilities for the Willow Acres development. One service line replacement/repair inspection was conducted for 1419 Lampeter Road. We also inspected a new service connection for 100 Summit Drive (clubhouse building) of Willow Acres Stage 3 and an initial/preliminary inspection for 100 Springhouse Way (20 EDUs) of Penn Grant Commons Phase 1.

D. MUNICIPAL PARTNERS

Based on the City of Lancaster's future Capital Sewer Projects List, as last updated in July 2022, SLSA's projected escrow payments due to the City for the next 6 months are summarized below.

For the projects nos. 5 and 6 listed above, CDM Smith participated in a meeting with the City and ELSA on August 2, 2022 to discuss revised Partner cost share amounts as determined by the City for these unique projects in response to ELSA's proposed different cost share amounts for consideration by the City and SLSA.

E. FINANCIAL MATTERS

Annual Audit – As authorized by the Authority in June, Trout CPA is proceeding with preparing the annual audit for fiscal year 2022 (ending June 30, 2022). CDM Smith will provide requested information/documentation to Trout for the audit.

F. SEWER SYSTEM OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE

A meeting was held with representatives of the City of Lancaster on August 10, 2022 to discuss operation and maintenance issues. A summary of ongoing issues discussed with the City is attached to this Engineer's Report. The monthly update of the pumping station flow tabulation is also attached to this Engineer's Report.

G. PRE-SLSA SEWER LINE REPLACEMENT PROJECT

Based on an alternatives analysis prepared and discussed with the Authority in 2021, the Authority expressed agreement with the recommended alternative of pipe bursting along the alignment of the existing sewer main. Accordingly, CDM Smith is proceeding with the engineering design work based on pipe bursting and Blakinger Thomas is proceeding with obtaining necessary sewer easements (from the 34 property owners). An in-person meeting of SLSA officials and consultants with the property owners/residents was held on September 30, 2021 at the West Lampeter Township building. In November 2021, the residents were mailed a revised sewer easement agreement and informed that



a webpage has been added to SLSA's website for the project. Email addresses were also requested for ease in providing future project notices/updates to the residents. Hershey Surveying completed a detailed topographic survey of the project site in December. At the March SLSA meeting, CDM Smith presented preliminary design plans to the Authority. As discussed in March and April, CDM Smith has prepared individual lot plans and letters that depict and describe likely construction on each property. These individual lots plans and letters were mailed to the residents on May 16, with comments requested to be received by May 30. Comments have been received from a few residents and CDM Smith has discovered/investigated some illicit storm drain connections to SLSA's system. As discussed at the June SLSA meeting, the Authority has scheduled a second meeting with the residents for August 22, 2022, primarily to discuss signing of sewer easement agreements. Accordingly, CDM Smith issued a meeting notification letter to the residents on July 18, 2022. This project may be included on SLSA's pending list of projects for funding needs, particularly for potential American Rescue Plan federal funding allocated to the townships.

H. PENNSYLVANIA ONE CALL

During the month of July, CDM Smith received a total of 132 tickets from PA One Call System, Inc., 78 of which required sewer location, 16 required provision of plans to a requestor, and none required meeting attendance.



1. Grease Cleaning

JG Environmental last cleaned Sterling Place PS on August 4 and Lyndon PS on April 26. Jefferson Square PS was also cleaned on August 4. CDM Smith inspected the other pump stations in July/August for FOG buildup and found that no other stations needed to be cleaned.

At Sterling Place PS, the grease blanket on the water surface in the wet well continues to cause false low-level alarms of the ultrasonic level sensor. To alleviate these nuisance alarms, the low-level alarm has been disabled temporarily in the OmniSite system, and CDM Smith met with Siemens technical support on July 25 to field verify/address the unit operations. Upon further investigation there were not substantial changes that could be made to the unit.

2. Chemical Addition Program

For the new the new dosing systems installed by Evoqua at SLSA's three large pumping stations (Lyndon, Mill Creek, and Goods Run), CDM Smith is coordinating with GES Automation Technology to develop record schematic electrical drawings (one line wiring diagrams) for documentation of the as-built electrical configurations of the dosing systems. A quote for \$640 from GES for this work was approved by the Authority in July. GES is proceeding with this work. The obsolete electrical schematics at the pumping stations will be removed when new versions are available. GES will provide CDM Smith and the City with a draft version of the as-built drawings for review prior to finalization.

3. Mill Creek Pumping Station

During the Chapter 94 pumping station inspection in February, the two check valves for Pumps #3 and #4 were found to be leaking back flow when the pumps are off. The Authority approved the rebuild cost quote of \$12,634.00 and the City has ordered the parts. Parts are expected to arrive by the end of August.

Additionally, two surge relief valves, eight pressure sensors, and four flexible expansion joints on pump suction and/or discharge piping at Mill Creek Pumping Station were found to be faulty or badly deteriorated. CDM Smith is coordinating with the City and vendors to obtain cost quotes for replacement or rebuild of these items.

For the surge relief valves, these have been rebuilt/replaced previously by the City but continue to have issues every couple of years. CDM Smith has reached out to Hillegas Valve Repair to have them evaluate the valves and give recommendations to alleviate this recurring issue.

For the eight faulty pressure sensors (seal water and pump discharge for each pump), CDM Smith met with Edwin L. Heim Company (Heim) at the station on June 23 and Heim subsequently provided a quote for \$23,999 (COSTARS pricing) for purchase and installation of new sensors, which was approved by the Authority in July. The parts are expected to arrive in the beginning of September.

In June, the City reported that three lights in the wet well area have burned out and are need of replacement due to corrosion of the light fixtures and electrical components. The City obtained a replacement cost quote from Shaedler Yesco for \$3,396.17 and the Authority approved the work at their June meeting. Upon receipt the City electricians will install the new light fixtures. Equipment is expected to arrive by the end of July.

4. Goods Run Pumping Station

The City reported in June that the Muffin Monster channel grinder #2 motor shorted out. The City removed the grinder unit and sent it to Heim for further evaluation. In July, the Authority approved a quote for \$5,500 from Heim for repair/rebuild of the motor and drive system The City will coordinate with Heim to complete this repair.

5. Silver Lane Pumping Station

In August, the City reported that the 60 hp motor for a submersible pump at Silver Lane PS had a seal issue that could not be resolved in the field. The pump was removed for evaluation by Motor Technology Inc (MTI). The City installed the dedicated spare pump (stored at the City WWTP) for this station on August 2, which required coring a new penetration through the wet well top slab to accommodate thicker lead wires. MTI subsequently provided the City with the attached pricing for repair (\$13,119) and replacement (\$49,621) of the 60 hp motor. The repaired pump will become the new dedicated spare pump.

6. Millstream Village Pumping Station

In June, the City reported that Pump #2 was pulled and sent to Heim for evaluation due to high vibrations coming from the pump. In July, the Authority approve a quote from Heim for \$9,500 for repair/rebuild of the pump. The City will coordinate with Heim to perform the pump repair.

7. New Pumping Station for the Willow Acres Development

For the Willow Acres development in Pequea Township construction of sanitary sewer facilities, including a new pumping station to be dedicated to SLSA, is nearing completion. On April 26, general start-up and training for the pumps control panel for CDM Smith and City personnel occurred. On May 10, start-up and training for the generator and ATS occurred. Operation of the pumping station was be turned over to the City on Monday May 16 and the first day for resident occupancy was May 19. Punchlist items are in the process of being addressed by Vanguard/Kinsley, including replacement of the exhaust system (parts expected to arrive this fall).

8. Resiliency Planning

Based the Authority's consideration of CDM Smith's finalized resiliency technical memorandum, as discussed at the July SLSA meeting, CDM Smith developed more detailed costs and design information for installation of electrical connections and purchase of a trailer-mounted generator for placement at Jefferson Square Pumping Station only. A cost quotation from Edwin L. Heim Company for purchase and installation of the electrical connections and appurtenances was approved by the Authority at the September 2021 meeting. CDM Smith will obtain a quotation for a trailer-mounted generator based on more detailed generator specifications. A required by West Lampeter Township, CDM Smith submitted an electrical permit application to Township on June 30, 2022.

At the requested of the City in July, CDM Smith is developing an emergency call list for SLSA of preferred vendors/contractors to assist operations with emergency situations.

9. Erosion within SLSA's Easement near the City WWTP Outfall

The SLSA committee for this activity reported further coordination with Gannett Fleming on the preparation of 60% design plans. Based on the City's recent decision not to provide a release to SLSA for any design alternative for restoration of the WWTP outfall channel, the Authority approved changing the selected design alternative from Option 4 to Option 3 (modified). The design includes replacing the deteriorated gabion baskets with R-6/R-7 riprap, possibly grouting some of the riprap, use of the existing plunge pool, and modification of the concrete apron to create a stepped plunge. The previously proposed realignment/relocation of the Lyndon Forcemain (LYFM) to under the concrete apron (rather than to within New Danville Pike) is no longer being considered. Blakinger Thomas submitted an ARPA funding request to Lancaster County in May for this project, and the County responded to request letters of commitment from funding partners (participating townships in this case). Subsequently, the Authority has reached out to the townships (including attending the West Lampeter Township BOS meeting on July 11) and three townships all confirmed their commitment to the project. Blakinger Thomas will submit a revised/amended ARPA funding request to the County accordingly. Gannett Fleming met with PENNVEST on July 12 and confirmed that SLSA is only eligible for a low interest loan from PENNVEST, not grant funding.

The Authority decided that anticipated costs for preparing a PENNVEST application and for complying with other PENNVEST requirements are too burdensome to be worthwhile for a PENNVEST loan for this project.

At the March meeting, CDM Smith presented scope and cost (~ \$25,000) information for using existing air release valve vaults and one test pit location (within a portion of the SLSA sewer easement outside New Danville Pike) for conducting a condition assessment of the older parallel LYFM. The Authority approved CDM Smith to proceed with this simplified pipe condition assessment approach. The field work for this forcemain condition assessment was completed during the week of June 10. CDM Smith provided the Board with a technical memorandum on July 27 to detail our findings and recommendations from this forcemain condition assessment, primarily that no immediate repairs to the older parallel LYFM are currently needed. As requested by the Authority, CDM Smith will plan for ongoing periodic condition assessment of the LYFM and other SLSA forcemains, and will document this plan in the Annual Chapter 94 Report and/or another suitable SLSA document. CDM Smith is continuing to coordinate with Gannett Fleming on the work being done for both parallel Lyndon Forcemains.

CDM Smith is continuing to conduct monthly inspections of the site from the surface (i.e. not dewater the channel again).

10. Exposed Sewer Mains at the Crossings at Rocky Springs

For the two exposed SLSA gravity sewer mains on the Crossings at Rocky Springs (CARS) development that discovered by CDM Smith in August 2021, temporary restoration of the stormwater channel erosion that caused the pipes to become exposed was completed by Sean Way Excavating (at the expense of the CARS HOA/Woo-Cat Property Management) in April 2022. CDM Smith will follow up with the CARS HOA/Woo-Cat Property Management on the design and construction of more permanent stormwater channel restoration measures.

11. Tree Trimming/Removal

The Authority previously approved a quote for \$3,800 from DWD Landscaping for tree trimming/removal at three pumping stations (Lyndon PS, Good Run PS, and Silver Lane PS). The tree trimming was completed at Lyndon PS and Goods Run PS in July.

As reported at the May SLSA meeting, CDM Smith was contacted by PPL regarding the sycamore tree on this SLSA property that PPL would like to cut down to avoid interference with the power lines in the area. In August, the City reported this work had been completed. CDM Smith will visit that station to determine if any further action is necessary.

12. Next Meeting

The next O&M meeting is scheduled for 9:00 am on Wednesday, September 14.

July 2022 - Monthly Maintenance Report for SLSA System

A total of 21 work orders were completed and 153.5 hours were spent maintaining SLSA equipment. These hours are the result of weekday and weekend station checks as well as preventative and corrective maintenance.

- 7-5 City maintenance cleaned strainers at Hans Herr PS, cleaned the still wells at Lyndon PS and Mill Creek PS and dropped by all stations for generator testing. These are weekly work orders and were also completed on 7-12, 7-19, and 7-26.
- 7-9 Packing on Pump #3 at Mill Creek was redone by weekend mechanic. Leak was substantial.
- 7-19 Additional work orders were completed for bubbler maintenance, air relief valve testing, and siphon chamber checks.
- 7-26 City mechanics conducted wet well inspections along with lighting and landscape checks. Silver Lane PS wet well was identified as high priority for FOG cleaning along with Jefferson Square PS.
- 7-27 City electricians tested generator batteries at SLSA stations with industry standard load tester. The charging systems were also tested for operation.
- 7-28 City electricians continued generator battery and charging system checks.
- 7-29 City electricians continued generator battery and charging system checks.

Other Notable Information for the Month:

SLSA has approved the repair work for Goods Run PS #2 comminutor motor and the Millstream Village PS #2 submersible sewage pump with Heim Electric. The invoice for generator repairs at Millstream Village PS in June has been received from Winter Engine - Generator Service Inc.
